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## A Word From Our Pastor

In my reading this week, I came across this anecdote:

Jack Martens is a middle school band teacher in San Francisco. For thirty-three years he has braved the challenges of less-than-ideal teaching conditions to live out his faith. Over 50 percent of Martens' students are from broken homes, on welfare, or from families where English is not the first language. And funding for the arts has all but disappeared in Jack's school district.

Still the fifty-six-year-old, bearded band teacher shepherds his students through the trials of life. "I love these kids," he says. "And they love me. In me they can see my love for Jesus Christ."

Although Martens keeps a Bible and other Christian symbols on his desk, it is his interaction with the kids that is his primary witness. He eats lunch with his kids to help them talk through their problems. He stays after school to help them with difficult fingerings on their instruments. Through the mechanics of music he is able to show his students they are capable of something beautiful.

Preachers very often speak of our own calling to preach as if it is the pinnacle of Christian service. Even though most will still say, "God calls everyone, no matter the profession!" many people walk away with the sense that every calling except vocational ministry is incomplete at best.

One of the goals of my personal ministry is to refute that notion in the minds of people. There is nothing incomplete or missing in the story I just told you. Like so many teachers I know, Jack shows his students their worth in profound ways, in ways that can help the gospel message take root. Every task God sets before us is holy. Every calling from God is whole and real. It may not even be tied to a job, but God calls every one of us with purpose and vision. Let us embrace God's call in our lives!

Sunday School While there is much to be said for building knowledge of the basic stories of our faith (in Sunday School), such knowledge should not serve as the sole criterion for small-group settings in our congregations. The Scriptures proclaim that human beings are fundamentally created for relationship with God and one another. The Hebrew Scriptures describe these relationships in terms of covenant — God calls us to be God's people; as we respond, G od promises to be our God.

Benefits of Small Group Study (Sunday School) include:

Keeping in touch with God: Consistently work to develop relationship with God.

<u>Keeping in touch with God's people:</u> Keeping in touch with group members means knowing about personality types, learning styles, spiritual formation preferences, age-level characteristics, and other aspects of human growth and development. Group experiences then can be shaped to match the interests and needs of the group members.

<u>Keeping in touch with our experiences:</u> Our experience shapes our perceptions about God and about belonging to the church. Our beliefs, values, and attitudes, in turn, influence the way we interpret our experience. Sunday school classes are conducive to helping people reflect on their experience in light of Scripture and church teachings.

<u>Keeping in touch with the world</u>. The church is an extension of the ministry of Jesus Christ. In the name of Christ, we offer words of hope, encouragement, challenge, and direction. The church exists to serve the world, not itself. Groups come up with ideas and find ways to participate in the ongoing mission and ministry of the congregation.




