
FROM OUR PASTOR:

I heard a story about a drunk man who fell asleep in a hotel lobby. While in his drunken stupor, some teenage pranksters rubbed limburger cheese on the man's upper lip. When he woke up, he smelled this terrible odor and said, "This hotel smells awful!" He went outside and still smelled the odor and he cried: "This neighborhood smells terrible." 



From one of Stephen's sermons, "When we love each other our lives blossom with fruit. It's good to have fruity people at church! We need to have an orchard full of fruit! The fruit needs to look so sweet and smell so good that it makes you want to taste and see that the LORD is good. It takes small things to love those around us. When we do, it transforms us. The fire within us is rekindled. We get excited about what God is doing. Our mission is to share the love of Christ."

Our hope is that through this ministry we, Kaufman FUMC, can show love to our neighbors with something so simple and satisfying as soup.

The way it works: Quart jars of soup and ready-to-eat cakes are available for you to grab a jar from the shelf in Fellowship Hall to take to someone you plan to visit.

Do you know someone that is homebound, sick and needs nourishment, just home from the hospital, needs encouragement? Visit them - take them soup! Visiting someone that hasn't been to church in a while? Show them that we love them and have not forgot about them, take them cake! Do you have a friend that just needs to remember that someone cares? Take them soup or cake! Do you have a new neighbor? Invite them to church & take them soup!

From the Heart has already gone beyond our walls. The Kaufman sewing group is making and donating soup bowl cozies that can be used in the microwave when warming a bowl of soup. A local chef is coming to teach the Rachel group how to safely can soups using a pressure canner. Mary Terry and Pat Arellano have made beautiful greeting cards that are available to give to those you are visiting. The Kaufman Bee Club members are donating some of the funds for food and supplies. We welcome any contributions in Stephen's memory. We also have the support of Stephen's family.

We are grateful for everyone that has already put so much of their heart into this ministry. We are excited to see how many people will be blessed, both as givers and recipients.
