FROM OUR PASTOR:

Luke 15:1-7

Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. 2 And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them."

3 So he told them this parable: 4 "Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? 5 When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. 6 And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.' 7 Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.

We love stories. I don't know many people who would say otherwise. We love powerful stories. Happy stories. Stories of loss and redemption. It's one of the most relatable things about Jesus – he loves to tell stories. So we listen to Jesus' stories, and I think we often assume we know exactly what they mean. But Lent is about putting away our assumptions, our arrogance, and our short-sightedness to re-focus on what we are truly hearing from Jesus.

Who are the lost sheep? It's an important question. When Jesus explains why he unapologetically rubs shoulders with the "tax collectors and sinners," he tells this story of the joy of recovering one who wandered away. So, if we're in church, worshiping, praying, reading the Scripture, listening to the sermon, we're obviously not the lost sheep, right?

Fair enough. But the better question for us might be, "have we wandered away from the shepherd?" Have we, the flock of God, left the care of the Jesus we belong to in search of other shepherds or other promises?

1 Corinthians 10:1-13 reminds us that everyone faces temptations, but God will always provide a way out, so we can stay strong in our faith and choose to do what's right.

Let's talk about temptations!

What are temptations?

Think of temptations as little whispers or strong urges to do something that isn't good or that we know we shouldn't do.

Do we all sometimes face temptations?

Of course we do...everyone faces temptations! Let us say that to ourselves again...EVERYONE face temptations, and even the Israelites in the Bible faced temptations.

What does 1 Corinthians 10:1-13 tell us?

The good news is God is faithful, and He will always be faithful and will always give you a way out of temptation, so you can stand strong and choose to do what's right.




But how do we stay strong?
