## PRESIDING BISHOP'S EPISTLE

Dearly beloved in Christ,

*We believe in one God, the Father almighty,  
maker of all things visible and invisible;  
And in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the Son of God,  
begotten from the Father, only-begotten,  
that is, from the substance of the Father,  
God from God, light from light,  
true God from true God, begotten not made,  
of one substance with the Father,  
through Whom all things came into being,  
things in heaven and things on earth,  
Who because of us men and because of our salvation came  
down,  
and became incarnate and became man, and suffered,  
and rose again on the third day, and ascended to the  
heavens,  
and will come to judge the living and dead,  
And in the Holy Spirit.  
But as for those who say, There was when He was not,  
and, Before being born He was not,  
and that He came into existence out of nothing,  
or who assert that the Son of God is of a different  
hypostasis or substance,  
or created, or is subject to alteration or change  
– these the Catholic and Apostolic Church anathematizes.*

With these words, the original version of our Creed (nicknamed 'N') from the First Ecumenical Council of Nicea I, which Council was held from 20<sup>th</sup> May 325 to early July 325, we celebrate in this new year of grace and salvation the 1700<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the First General Council of the Holy Catholic Church. A blessed and happy new year to you all! We encourage all parishes and missions of the Anglican Province of America to observe a special day or Sunday this year in commemoration of God's gift to us of our statement of Orthodox and Apostolic Faith in the Most Blessed Trinity and the true Deity and Incarnation of Our Lord, God, and Saviour Jesus Christ. If one waxes

bold, one may use this original version of the Nicene Creed at a special liturgy, a Creed which both clearly affirms the Eternal Son of God as *homoousios*, being of One Substance or Essence with the Father, and condemns with equal clarity all the pernicious errors of the heresiarch Arius. It is a remarkable year in which to be a Catholic Christian! 2025 is a momentous year in the history of Christ's earthly Kingdom, Holy Mother Church.

It is my joy to offer this ninth Presiding Bishop's Epistle as we enter 2025. This letter will provide a review of events from autumn of last year through Holy Week and Easter of this year.

### ***Hurricanes and outreach***

We continue to persevere in prayer for all those affected by the dreadful and shockingly destructive hurricanes which struck the Southern States in September 2024, Helene and Milton. The devastation wrought by these storms in North Carolina, Tennessee, Georgia, and Florida is hard to comprehend. Please know of our eternal gratitude for everyone who so lovingly and selflessly contributed to our APA Hurricane Relief Fund. Thanks to your generosity and support, we have been able to assist several families directly impacted. Funding remains to help other families still, so if one becomes aware of a specific need, please do not hesitate to contact the Diocesan Office. Immediately after Helene, I was privileged to make an episcopal visitation to Holy Cross Church, Knoxville, Tennessee on the weekend of 28<sup>th</sup> September. A truly grand dinner was served to the congregation on Saturday evening, a fundraiser designed to solicit financial support for the ongoing expansion of the Holy Cross building. But given the disaster which struck just hours before the event, Father Scott Greene marvellously asked those present first to consider financial donations for those suffering from the hurricane's wrath. There can be no doubt that there will be ultimate

blessings both for those most in need and for the building project of Holy Cross. Several Confirmations ensued on Sunday. Holy Cross is growing so rapidly that it is now challenged to house everyone on Sundays. Two Sunday Masses will likely be the next step of accommodation for the many souls there.

On 11<sup>th</sup> October, I was most gratified to bring official greetings to the Diocese of the Central and Western States Synod via Zoom. We thank Bishop Robert Giffin and all the clergy and faithful of the DCWS for their determined and indefatigable ministries! It was terrific to have some time with everyone and to learn about the goings-on and status of life and work in the Diocese. The same weekend, on 13<sup>th</sup> October, I was thrilled to return to a true spiritual home, Saint Alban's Church, Joppa, Maryland, for the annual episcopal visitation and Confirmations. Dean Gordon Anderson always ensures that one is made to feel right at home in that unique parish.

On 9<sup>th</sup> November, I rejoiced to consecrate the beautiful building of Saint Peter's Church, Kingsport, Tennessee, with the full rite of consecration and to burn the mortgage of the same. A massive accomplishment for Saint Peter's! On the following day, a record class of confirmands received Holy Confirmation during the Sunday Mass. We most earnestly thank Father Yossi Sarid for his almost two-year's service as Vicar of Saint Peter's. Father Yossi has now transferred back to the Diocese of the Central and Western States as he moved to New Mexico to accept a new calling and ministry as Director of Chaplains at the VA hospital. Father Paul Castellano of the Anglican Catholic Church has kindly stepped in to serve as our supply priest in Kingsport.

A highlight of recent visitations was the Eucharistic Festival Day with Mass, teaching, Solemn Evensong, and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament at Saint Paul's Church, Melbourne, Florida on 16<sup>th</sup> November. A full day was devoted to Our Eucharistic Lord, a day which included the complete panoply of worship and a presentation on both the Real Substantial Presence and the Eucharistic Sacrifice. The next day witnessed another huge Confirmation group at Saint Paul's. Dean Brian Oldfield is very busy and excels as he balances so much in this premiere Church.

It was a supreme honour to visit Saint Alban's Cathedral, Oviedo, Florida, on the weekend of 14<sup>th</sup> December, during which I was able to spend a Friday evening with Bishop Walter and Mary Grundorf. Please continue fervently to pray for Bishop Grundorf as he receives cancer treatment. He is doing very well indeed; in fact, he looks healthy, and is responding well to his medical care. On Saturday of the visit, it was an enormous blessing to spend some quality time with Dean Ralph Waterhouse and the men's group of the parish, and to have dinner with the large assembly of aspirants, postulants, and candidates for Holy Orders from Saint Alban's. On Sunday, after preaching and celebrating, I was treated to a delightful service of Nine Lessons and Carols in Advent in the evening. Saint Alban's boasts one of the greatest choirs in the Continuing Church. On both Sunday afternoon and Monday morning, I received a full tour of all of the facilities and classrooms of the Ecclesial Schools Initiative at Saint Alban's with Doctor Kevin Clark, and then met all 190+ students at Monday Morning Prayer. A sight to behold – the largest APA school! The Lord is doing wonders at Saint Alban's Oviedo.

Father Allen Fisher and the faithful of Saint Michael the Archangel Church, Matthews, North Carolina, graciously welcomed me for the annual visitation on the weekend of 21<sup>st</sup> December, whereupon I was extended the courtesy of the Altar for the celebration of my 28<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Priestly Ordination and was fed one of the finest meals I have ever enjoyed in my life! Brett Ford and his team are extraordinary chefs. The Sunday Mass was simply lovely.

An unexpected snowstorm, quite rare in Atlanta, prevented me from celebrating the consecration of the new glorious building of Saint Gabriel's Church, Coral Springs, Florida on the weekend of 11<sup>th</sup> January and to celebrate Sunday Mass and Confirmations, but Bishop Bill Perkins ably and wonderfully intervened at the last minute to make the liturgies possible. Heartiest congratulations to Saint Gabriel's and Father Scott Koszalinski, and thank you, Bishop Bill, for your ministry! We praise the Lord for the reborn and rebranded Saint Gabriel's Church, which has started a new life and ministry with a splendid new facility.

On 19<sup>th</sup> January, it was a tremendous grace to be invited to visit Saint Patrick's Church, Brevard, North Carolina and

to bless the astonishingly well-crafted and ethereal reredos of the High Altar, newly-constructed by our own Deacon Robert Shoup. It is an incredible example of the highest calibre of Church fabric. It will take your breath away when you see it in person. Father Nick Henderson is always the consummate host. On 27<sup>th</sup> January was a Provincial Council meeting via Zoom.

### ***Newest DEUS Parish***

At the Diocese of the Eastern United States Standing Committee meeting, 29<sup>th</sup> January, 2025, Saint James On-the-Glebe Mission was granted parish status after meeting the diocesan requirements. The Reverend Kevin C. Fife was approved as duly-elected Rector-elect. Congratulations to Father Fife and the congregation of Saint James On-the-Glebe on this superb milestone.

Please remember to join us for the 2025 Spring Clergy Retreat at the magnificent Saint James On-the-Glebe Church in Gloucester, Virginia, from 5<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> May 2025! The Glebe, a historic foundation of the colonial Church of England, is the Continuing Church's oldest property, and is an idyllic sanctuary for all with a profound Anglican heritage. There will be plenty of time for exploration of the grounds for contemplation and group fellowship. All meals, except for breakfast, which is included with the hotel stay, will be provided at the Glebe, thus offering more time for fellowship and enjoyment of the locale. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.*

### APA Global Mission News

#### **Visit to India January 7-21, 2025**

Bishop David Haines and Rev. Paul Rivard visited seventeen churches in seven districts in Andhra Pradesh belonging to our Global Partner, The Anglican Church of South India. The purpose of the visit was to review the progress of the church and to offer support for their newly consecrated (2023) Presiding Bishop, Richard Rajesh Kumar Panem. The team worked from three major population centers; Jammalamadugu, Tirupati, and Sallurapeta. A detailed travelogue is being distributed with this Epistle.

### DCWS News

All Saints, Prescott, Arizona, has departed the DCWS and is seeking reception into the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA), Diocese of the Rocky Mountains, though it is not yet finalized, so they are independent. The Rev. Ian Dunn has been deposed from ministry in this Church.

Candidate John Watson of St. Andrew's, Jacksonville, OR, has been approved for ordination to the diaconate. This will occur sometime in Spring 2025. A date has not yet been finalized.

### APA Spring Clergy Retreat, May 5-8, 2025

### Schedule:

The DEUS Board of Examining Chaplains (BEC) will arrive on the evening of Monday, May 5, and conduct its meeting and candidate interviews on Tuesday, May 6th. The DEUS Bishop's Advisory Committees (BAC) Upper and Lower will hold any necessary interviews on May 6th. All APA clergy, spouses, and DEUS committee members are welcome to arrive by May 6th for a meet-n-greet reception at 5pm followed by dinner at 6pm at the Glebe. Wednesday, May 7th, will have a morning and early afternoon session, with lunch provided, and then time for fellowship and exploring the grounds after the afternoon session. The DEUS Standing Committee will meet on Wednesday mid-afternoon. Dinner will be provided for all at the Glebe that evening. Thursday, May 8th will be the last session with the conclusion of the retreat by noon.

As required by APA Canon 43, all churches in the Province are to turn in their annual Parochial Reports (Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 2024) to their Bishop Ordinary. The deadline is March 1 each year. All forms must be submitted online via the APA website at [www.anglicanprovince.org](http://www.anglicanprovince.org) under the "More" tab, then APA Documents & Resources> Parish Life> Annual Parochial Report. answers before entering online is also available on the website. The online form will automatically send the parish data to the APA office and send a copy to the church email address used for submission. The church data will be forwarded to the Bishop Ordinary for each diocese.

### Non-parochial Clergy Reporting by March 1

As a non-parochial priest not in charge of a parish, the APA Canons state that you must give a report at least yearly to your Diocesan Bishop. (*Canon 43, Section 1 of the APA Canons reads in part: "And every Minister not in charge of any Parish or Congregation shall also report his occasional services and if there have been none, the causes or reasons which have prevented the same."*) This does not have to be a formal letter; an email will suffice. Please include your most current email and physical mailing address and phone(s) so we can ensure our records are accurate. We would enjoy and appreciate hearing from you.
